It was well attended and a wonderful evening. The students had a great performance. After the concert, the parents and performers enjoyed delicious pizza in the cafeteria. The pizza was a fundraiser for the Middle School’s Positive Behavior in Schools. This program helps us create fun activities for our students. Mr. Tucker expressed thanks for the support as there were 35 preorders, 50 orders from the community, and the High School baseball and track teams came in for a bite to eat after their practices. It was a great time for all! The Middle School baseball team suffered a tough loss yesterday to Pitman; 6 to 2; however, they played very well. Coach Lehman is excited about the interest in the team this year because they currently have 21 players. Coach Rulon has 16 girls playing Middle School Softball. They’re playing Clementon and hoping for a win. Middle School Track has 45 kids total on the team this year. They are going to have 5 meets and 1 relay this season. Last meet the boys and girls took first place in long jump and discus; the girls also took first place in the 4 X 1 relay, and the boys took first place in the shot putt.
