NJ Trees For School Grant

In May, 65 trees were planted at Clayton schools and Haupt Field through a Trees for Schools grant. Clayton Public School District received \$21,643 to cover tree costs over three years. The Green Team Chair, Facilities Manager, and Groundskeeper facilitated successful planting with support from Four Seasons Nursery. Nikolaos Koutsogiannis, the Clayton Public School District Superintendent said, "We are honored to be chosen as recipients of the Trees for Schools grant. The trees are more than just a beautification project, they also provide learning opportunities as our students watch them grow." The grant program is a collaboration between NJ DEP, Sustainable Jersey, and The College of New Jersey, funded by RGGI auction proceeds to plant over 3,000 trees statewide.

CPSD-A Leader in SEL

The **Clayton Model Child Connection Center** (CCC) has been serving Clayton students continuously since 2012. Due to its success in service and implementation, it was adopted by the State in 2021 as a pilot program in neighboring schools. The CCC provides SEL support for students in Herma Simmons, offering individual, small group supports, classroom SEL lessons, and teacher/parent consultations. Recently, Assemblyman David Bailey visited Herma Simmons, touring the center and seeing firsthand how the CCC staff work to help students "come to the classroom ready to learn." During his visit, Assemblyman David Bailey commended the efforts of the CCC staff and the positive impact they have had on the students at Herma Simmons.

The success of the CCC model in Clayton and its subsequent adoption by the State highlights the growing recognition of the importance of prioritizing the social and emotional development of students. By providing a safe and supportive environment for students to develop essential skills such as selfawareness, social awareness, and responsible decision-making, programs like the CCC are instrumental in preparing students for success both in and out of the classroom.

As the pilot program continues to show positive outcomes, it is hoped that more resources will be allocated to support similar initiatives in schools state-wide. The dedication of the CCC staff and their commitment to helping students thrive serve as a shining example of the positive impact that social-emotional support can have on the lives of young learners.

The administrators and staff worked together to throw a "Pizza Fundraiser Night" at the 2024 Spring Concert. The event was a smashing success as the aroma of freshly baked pizzas wafted through the air, enticing concert-goers with every slice. 








ACTION FOR EARTH MONTH APRIL 2024


Jazz Festival 🎝
